9.9.20 PLAY PARK

The report on the progress of the play park project was circulated amongst members, the main points included:

- The independent play park inspection was called in and several snagging issues was identified. These minor issues are to be resolved before completion of the play park project.
- The new fencing is installed and it looks good.
- There was an infestation with wasps around willow trees on the north-west corner of the play park.
- A specialist was called in and we were told that wasps are attracted to willow sap at the end of summer. The Council has agreed to fell these trees and replace it with different suitable species.
- The new bin is installed by the gate to the playpark, which will be emptied once a week by volunteers arranged by Wellow Recreation.

10.9.20 Wellow Recreation

The Members considered an installation an external noticeboard for the playing field and came to
a decision to ask Wellow Recreation and Wellow Valley Tennis to explore the possibility of
alternative ways of advertising and messaging such as online or inside the Pavilions when its safe to
do so.

11.9.20 Village Hall

A report was circulated amongst the PC members on the Village Hall and the playing fields drainage
problem. There are several separate issues to be dealt with to make the whole drainage system
function effectively, including jetting and clearing of the guttering and connection of pipes. It was
decided that the PC will approach specialists to clear the drainage system and identify further work
required.

12.9.20 Health and Wellbeing

• The PC has decided to support the initiative of Wellow Lunch Club to prepare and/or deliver food to older parishioners or someone who might be lonely once a month in the coming colder months. It was decided to support "Just giving" initiative, which will be set up by the Village Shop by donating £100 and to ask if other community groups would like to contribute to support this initiative.
