Cycle Paths

Sustrans Cycle Route no.24 Colliers Way runs through Wellow (accessible next to the trekking centre) to Bath and on to Bristol following the old railway line. It also runs from Radstock to Frome through local villages like Mells.

Footpaths

There are beautiful footpaths in and around the Village, such as walking along the Wellow brook to Stoney Littleton where there is an ancient burial ground. The walks behind the church are also lovely, leading to Twinhoe and Combe Hay or just taking a circle back to village via Farm Lane.

Bridleways

There are miles of bridlepaths in the area enabling long off-road rides around the district: one past the Long Barrow is considered by many to be one of the top rides in the south-west. Lovely circular rides enable local villages to be easily accessible on horseback. Short 1 hour rides around Wellow give great views over the hedges.

Defibrillator

The automated external defibrillator is located in the former telephone box in the square. This can be accessed in an emergency by smashing the glass to obtain the key to unlock the alarmed cabinet. The defibrillator pads for a child weighing less than 25kg are stored in the door of the cabinet. The defibrillator will instruct the operator how to use the defibrillator. Additionally, it collects children from King Edward's School in Bath on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays and from Prior Park College daily.

Refuse collection and recycling

Rubbish and recycling are collected on Monday mornings. Recycling is collected every week and other refuse is collected fortnightly. The following is from BANES. Website:

You can request for garden waste to be collected fortnightly at an additional cost. BANES gives the following instructions for refuse collections:

- Your rubbish needs to be put out in wheeled bin or re-usable rubbish bags depending on what your property has been allocated
- To check your allocation, please go to services in your area and enter your postcode. If you have any questions about your bin allocation, please contact council connect: councilconnect@bathnes.gov.uk / Tel: 01225 394041
- All your rubbish needs to be contained within your bin/bag and the lid needs to close properly. They will not collect extra bags of rubbish. If you do put out extra bag(s) of rubbish beside your bin/bag, the crews will not collect but will place a yellow sticker on the on the bag. This will explain that they do not take extra rubbish and that you must put it in your rubbish bin/bag for your next collection, or you can take it to your nearest Recycling Centre. If extra bags are left out you could be fined.
- Put your rubbish out by 7am on the collection day (or no earlier than 8pm the night before). Please bring your container back in on your collection day, do not leave bags or boxes on railings or steps

Help with putting your waste out

The council can help individuals who may have difficulty moving rubbish / recycling to the edge of the property for collection. To request an assisted collection you will need to complete a simple application form. For more information call: 01225 394041

Fare car

Wellow has been identified as a Fare car zone. Residents living in the designated Fare car zone who wish to use this service need to be issued with a Fare car membership number. Please call: 01225 394909 to obtain this. You will be asked your name, address and contact number. You will then be issued with your Fare car membership number.

Bookings must be made in advance of the time of travel.

To travel on a journey that arrives in Bath city centre at 10.30am please book no later than 9am.

For the journey that arrives in Bath city centre at 11.30am please book no later than 10am.

To travel on the journey that departs from Bath city centre at 12.30pm please book no later than 12noon.

For the journey that departs Bath city centre at 2pm please book no later than 1.30pm.

Bookings may be made up to 1 week in advance. Drop off and pick up locations are Henry street (by Marks & Spencer's) Upper Borough Walls (RNHRD main entrance)

Follow the steps below to make your booking:

1. Select the journey, or journeys, you wish to travel on from the timetable.
2. Phone Bath Taxi on 01225 447777 between 8am and 4pm Monday to Friday.
3. Quote the Fare Car membership number for each person wishing to travel.
4. Tell the operator the day/date you wish to travel, journey time, pick up address drop off location, and the details of the homeward journey if required. Please tell the operator if you are a wheelchair user.
5. You will then be given an approximate pick up time from your home address.

Park and ride

Dial-a-Ride

Dial-a-Ride is a door to door fully accessible minibus service for those who cannot use conventional public transport. This includes older adults, disabled individuals, parents with small children plus people of any age living in rural isolation. This service can be used to go shopping, attend appointments and play an active part in community life.

Wellow is covered by the Midsomer Norton and Radstock Dial-a-Ride Hopper Service. This service operates from 8am to 4pm on Mondays to Fridays excluding bank holidays.

You must register before you can book any journeys.
