#### **Shoscombe Parish Council February Update**

As Parish Council meetings are now being held bi-monthly, an update will be reported in the newsletter when there has not been a meeting.

Broadband: Gigaclear is still exploring the option of Shoscombe but there have been some hold ups with a 'major re-design'; There is some news as regards Truespeed though. There will be a road closure for the installation of Fibre Optic cabling. This is the notification regarding the closure of Barn Hill: Truespeed Communications LTD on 18<sup>th</sup> March 2019 for a maximum period of 2 weeks. The road will only be restricted as and when traffic signs are in position and may not be affected for the whole of the period but only for so long as is necessary to execute the works. This is anticipated to be for 9 calendar days.

Alternative Route - White Hill - Hang Hill - Gullen. Vice Versa

**757** bus which calls at Applecroft every Wednesday. It is uncertain how well used it is but here is the link to the timetable and route in case anyone would like to take advantage of the bus. Unfortunately, it will need to be used otherwise there is the risk that it may be withdrawn.

**Highways:** The large rut along Wellow Lane near the turning to Shoscombe has been reported again to Nick Sperring, the new Highways Inspector. The deterioration of the road surface at the bottom of Green Street and along Shoscombe Vale near Railway Terrace, has also been reported. .

**Planning:** There have been some planning applications since the last meeting but councillors have been liaising regarding responses and comments. These are: **19/00138/ADCOU** and **19/00137/FUL** and **19/00147/LBA.** All comments and plans can be accessed via the B&NES Planning Portal by either entering the above references or merely by typing Shoscombe in the search bar. Near neighbours have been consulted and councillors have had discussions with the applicant, Mr David Cradock.

**Tree cutting** at the recreation field. Western Power have still not undertaken the work with tree cutting at the recreation field .The relevant department has been contacted and a date will be given imminently.

Footpaths: The BANES footpath officer, Sheila Petherbridge, has contacted the council regarding any remediation work needed to the footpaths in the parish. Issues residents have noticed with footpaths should be reported to sheila\_petherbridge@bathnes.gov.uk There is a team of volunteers, including Bath Ramblers who are willing to undertake any remediation work including the following. Change of stiles to gates (some would need landowners permission), repair of bridges or treads, installation of signposting, clearances flights of or single steps, waymarking. Parish Council elections: As already mentioned, these are to take place in May and as some councillors are stepping replacements will be needed. More details on how to apply for the position of councillor will be given in the April newsletter and anyone who has already expressed an interest will be contacted by the clerk once notification regarding the election procedure is received from B&NES.

#### What's the hurry?

The day before the snow fell I dropped my boys off at St. Julian's School and took the dog up the hills above Wellow for a quick run. I'm preoccupied with a to-do list and hurry, head down, collar up, into the fields. 'If I go fast enough', I think to myself, 'I can be back at the car in fifteen minutes and at my desk in twenty'. Lottie circles a cowpat with intent, 'don't even think about it', I growl.

In a few minutes I am way above St Julian's Well. I slow down, not for the view but because one of my laces has untied. I ignore it. There's no time to stop. At that precise moment Lottie the dog disturbs a pheasant. It explodes from beneath the hedge in front of us, a firework of feathers and squawks that is so shocking that I let out an involuntary yelp and throw myself to the ground. I sit up sheepishly, hoping no one has seen me, and watch my lunatic dog chase the pheasant until it's just an inky blot in the sky. That's when I hear a voice.

Now let me be clear, it was not an actual voice, not a 'the curate's hearing voices' kind of voice, if you know what I mean, but definitely a kind of inner prompting. God?! I really can't say, but it was assertive, and I couldn't ignore it: 'Tom, what's the hurry?'

Tom, what's the hurry? As I sit there in the gorse, I realise there is no simple answer to that question. I take a deep breath, perhaps the first proper one of that day and then I look. I mean, properly look about me. What I see is quite simply breath-taking. The sun is a low, pale disc in the sky, and what it lacks in warmth it makes up for in colour, and such colour. The fields seem to glow, iridescent, luminous in the morning light. Each blade of grass, furred with ice, bristle in the stillness. They look like little pipe cleaners. I'm aware of movement and four deer run across the field. They spring effortlessly over the frozen plough and disappear into the shimmering hedgeline. I think of the Manley-Hopkins poem, 'The earth is charged with the grandeur of God'.

This moment, and it really was just a moment, was a wonderful gift in a very busy week, and to think I so nearly missed it. It was as if God was saying, 'Hello, I am here, right here, stop the hurrying and look, drink it in'.

I recently read that when the philosopher and theologian Dallas Willard, towards the end of his life, was asked by a student for any advice on the spiritual life, he replied, 'ruthlessly eliminate all hurry from your life'. The student pressed him for more wisdom. 'That is all', Willard replied, 'ruthlessly eliminate hurry, it is the great enemy of the spiritual life.' I think he was on to something. Hurry is a thief, and it will steal everything, given half a chance. As winter loosens its grip, let's do our best to 'ruthlessly eliminate hurry'. As we do, we may just see God's good gifts all around us, waiting to be received.
