O.H.M.S. by Matthew Street, The Vicar, based on Colossians 3: 23-24

"Whatever you do, do it with all your being for the Lord rather than any person, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as your reward. You serve the Lord Christ." Colossians 3: 23-24

What does it mean to call Jesus 'Lord'? On the one hand, it means to honour him, to give him our praise and adoration, as summed up by the popular chorus 'Jesus, we enthrone you'. But it means more than that. It has something of the idea encapsulated in those four letter above: letters that stand, of course, for 'On His Majesty's Service'. Admittedly, when they are stamped on formal correspondence the initials are largely figurative: our new King has no direct interest either way in our tax affairs, electoral intentions or other such matters. Yet the efficient administration of such things is essential to the smooth running of any kingdom. No doubt our newly crowned King will be highly gratified by the unbridled devotion of all his subjects, especially in an era when the monarchy is coming under ever-closer scrutiny, but I have no doubt that what also matters most to him is not adulation but service in its broadest sense.

I suspect the same may be true with Jesus. Of course, worship is vitally important, but if we leave it there, as we can so easily do, then it doesn't mean all that much. To call Jesus Lord, to honour him as king ultimately means one thing: reaching out to the world 'on his majesty's service'!

The Community Bus Rep mentioned that a new "Find the Bus: website has been launched for the bus users to see where the bus is.

Community Bus application for a Grant from Demand Responsive Transport fund has been unsuccessful so far. Updates will be provided at the later stage.

Planning Applications: The following planning applications were considered:

23/00970/TCA. Church Farm House: T1 (Spruce) Remove limb which overhangs neighbours property, back to fork. No Objection

23/01081/TCA: Court Farm House: T1 (Yew) Crown lift to 5 metres on roadside; T2 (Yew) Crown lift to 2 metres and reshape eastern side by 1 metre. No objection

The following planning application decisions by B&NES were NOTED:

23/00669/TCA: Milford Head, Mill Hill. T1 (Ash) fell due to early stage Ash Die Back. No objection

23/00666/TCA: West End House: 2 no. Lime trees: shorten/ remove branches overhanging West End House back to boundary up to the height of the house No objection

23/00616/FUL: The Old Orchard: Erection of a two-storey and single storey side extension (Part demolition of dwelling house). Permit

Highways and Transport: No updates were received from B&NES with regard to implementation of the 30mph along the road from Wellow to PSJ.

It was also mentioned that WestLink bus was used by residents and it seem work well. However, pre-booking required 3 hours in advance.

The advisory white lines at the Canteen Lane and High Street junction have been implemented.

The proposal to register the car park as a "green space" (owned by B&NES) and is a valued space as a car park was discussed.

Complaints were received from residents about inconsiderate parking on the Square. It was thought that parking is difficult to enforce.

Public Rights of Ways: Discussions took place about damage being done to the byway through Littleton Woods BA25/33 by $4 \ge 4$ enthusiast. It was noted that the land belongs to Hylton Estate. As only one complaint was received, this matter is not on top of the B&NES list of problems to deal with.

Community Infrastructure Levy: The Council Members have visited the site where the new bench is intended to be installed and thought that this space is suitable for a bench.

The Council reviewed quotes received for the new noticeboard and decided that these quotes are too high. A councillor offered to make a new Parish Council noticeboard himself at no extra charge in about three months time. Meanwhile the Village Shop noticeboard, which is located on the High street will be used for the parish council notices.

Wellow and Shoscombe Cemetery: Wellow and Shoscombe Cemetery financial accounts ending 31 March 2023 were reviewed and APPROVED.

Clerk reported that damage to the cemetery wall and the gates has been reported to the Police and the Insurance company. Quotes are being obtained for the repair work.

Local Government elections: As a result of uncontested election the Councillors nominated for the next 4 years are: Nick Chapman, Dave Workman and Mike Clarkson.

Wellow Parish Council now has 6 seats available to fill by co-option. Do you are passionate about your community and you want to help make a long-lasting change? Do you have innovative ideas for the council? Do you have concerns about a specific issue and want to do something about it? We need people from all backgrounds and experiences.
