"The spitting image" by Matthew Street, The Vicar, based on Colossians 1:15-17, 19-20

"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation, because through him all things in heaven and on earth were created, both visible and invisible, whether thrones, dominions, rulers or powers – each has been created through him and for him. He is before all, and everything holds together through him. In him, God was pleased fully to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things to himself, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross." (Colossians 1:15-17, 19-20)

'Isn't he like his dad!' we often say, or 'Isn't she like her mum!' 'Look at those eyes, that nose - the spitting image of his father! Look at her chin, her mouth - a dead ringer for her mother!' The similarities between parent and child can indeed be remarkable, and that usually extends further than mere physical resemblance. Like it or not, our gestures, mannerisms, temperaments and attitudes all betray our origins, far more than we might realise. Not that two people are ever the same, but there can be remarkable likenesses between them. However great these may be, though, they are nothing compared with the likeness Paul speaks of in his letter to the Colossians: that between Jesus and God. Here is a parallel unlike any other, closer and more striking even than perfectly identical twins, for the Son does not just resemble his Father; he is one with him, fully and completely making him known.

To know Jesus is to know God, to look at his life is to see God at work, to experience his love is to be touched by God's love in turn, and so it goes on.

This is a startling claim at any level, but altogether astonishing when we recall that the God we are talking about here is the same God who, according to the Old Testament, is enthroned in righteousness, mighty in power, greater than the human mind can comprehend and so holy that nothing impure can stand before him. A yawning gulf had separated him from humankind, any knowledge of him partial and once removed, but suddenly it is different - God made flesh, sharing our humanity and inviting us to share his life. That is the truth at the heart of the gospel. We are not limited simply to knowing about God; we are invited to know him for ourselves in a daily relationship with Christ - the spitting image of the Father!

Wellow Parish Council

As a result of uncontested election in May 2023 David Workman, Nick Chapman and Mike Clarkson were duly elected as Councillors of Parish of Wellow without contest.

The new Parish Council Members met on the 22 May 23 in the Village Hall. Chris Cook has been co-opted to become the Parish Councillor. Currently there are 4 members of the Parish Council and five vacant seats.

Anyone who lives in the village can become the parish councillor. If you would like to make a change and or passionate about your community, please contact the parish Clerk to find out how to join our team.

David Workman has been voted by the Council to be the Chairman. Nick Chapman has been voted to be the Vice- Chairman.

The following responsibilities were agreed:

Finance: Nick Chapman

Highways & Traffic: Chris Cook

Dave Workman and Nick Chapman were appointed as signatories for the Internet banking.

Public Participation: A resident raised an objection about planned installation of a bench by the stream. Concerns raised about dangers of frequently changing water levels, traffic, parking and inadequate protection fencing.

Another resident expressed concerns for public safety and also concerns about access to her property, which may be compromised by inconsiderate parking if the bench is installed at the place where it has been marked out. She is also expressed concerns that the bench will attract people with antisocial behaviour.

The Parish Sweeper has reported that the grass around Henley View has been cut.

Planning Applications: The following planning applications were considered:

22/02169/EOUT: Parcel 4234, Combe Hay Lane, Combe Hay. The Council submitted a response to B&NES, outlining a requirement for an extra exit from the development into Southstoke Rd. and/or Midford Rd to prevent future increased traffic going through Wellow.

23/01421/TCA: Winsford, High Street.- Fell Conifer T1. No objection from the parish council

23/01681/TCA: Honeysuckle Cottage, Bull's Hill. Fell Ash T1. No objection

The following planning decisions by B&NES Council since the last PC meeting were Noted:

23/00616/FUL: The Orchard, High Street. Erection of a two-storey and single storey side extension (Part demolition of dwelling house) Permitted.

Highways and Transport: There was no update. The Community Speed Watch has taken a break.

Wellow and Shoscombe Cemetery: The damaged gates to the cemetery have been repaired. The Clerk is in communication with the insurance company with regards to the claim for the damaged gate.

Wellow Recreation: The new Board of WR Trustees has been elected.

Cricket coaching sessions are offered in Wellow with free taster session for children.

The Flower Show is planned for the 2nd September and will be organised jointly between Wellow Rec and Horticultural Society with the intention of an eventual takeover of the non-horticultural activities by Wellow Rec. Parish Councillors will participate on the day of the Flower Show.

Community Infrastructure Levy: Councillors will visit the site, where the bench is intended to be installed in order to assess the risks, expressed by the residents.

The village noticeboard is currently undergoing renovation.

Ideas on how to spend the CIL funds are to be reviewed. Councillors discussed the results of the resident's survey, which was carried out previously.

Shredder



We have a shredder available for hire – a STIHL GHE250 Electric. It will chip/shred flower cuttings, vegetables, leaves, brambles, hedge trimmings, bushy twigs and branches with a thickness up to 30mm. My rule of thumb is "if I can cut it with secateurs, I can use this to shred it".

Using this shredder has transformed my ability to make useful compost, quickly. The compost gets much hotter, which results in most seeds being killed.

A message from the Environment Agency

The Environment Agency is urging people to be cautious if cooling off in rivers this summer.

Places like Wellow Gauging Station can be hazardous to swimmers as there can be hidden hazards – especially around weirs, bridges and flood channels.

Do not ignore the signage which warns of strong currents, underwater obstructions, sudden changes in water levels and steep banks.

The advice from the Respect the Water campaign is:

- If you get into trouble in the water, Float to Live.
- Lean back and use your arms and legs to help you float, then get control of your breathing before calling for help or swimming to safety.
- If you see someone else in trouble in the water, call 999 or 112. If you are at the coast, ask for the coastguard, if you are inland, ask for the fire service.

A spokesperson said: "While youngsters and even adults can sometimes be seen to be jumping into the water, there can be hidden dangers that could cause them to get into difficulties. We are urging parents to supervise their children closely in and around the water and make sure they do not go into the water alone".

"Our message is to come and enjoy the river and all that is going on around it, but please follow safety advice and always take heed of all signage and warnings signalling dangers and hazards – they are there to keep you safe."

Please do apply at www.birthdaybus.co.uk There you can apply for a special Birthday bus pass for free bus travel throughout the whole month of your Birthday. We have ambitious net zero targets in the West of England and 44% of our carbon emissions currently come from transport.

This is a plan to encourage people to try the buses and hopefully switch to them, which in turn will mean more fare income and so better buses in the future too. You'll need a digital style passport photo and a local address to apply - and to fill in a couple of quick questions about your travel habits.

WestLink Bus Service

We have been asked to tell you about the WestLink Bus service

What is WESTlink? WESTlink is the region's first on-demand bus service that runs without a fixed route and does not follow a timetable, unlike a traditional bus service.

Who can use WESTlink? WESTlink is available for anyone who wants to travel within the operating zones.

Where can I travel? WESTlink operates in 3 zones (see map). You can travel anywhere within a zone but not from one to another or more details on where you can travel, go to www.westlink.app.

What is the Future Transport Zone? This is a trial version of WESTlink, with longer operating hours, aimed at helping people get to employment areas not currently served by public transport.

How do I book? Booking is available via the WESTlink app, by calling 0117 457 8561 or via www.westlink.app.

When can I book? Journeys can be booked up to a day in advance and passengers can also book on-demand on the day of travel.

Do I need to know where my nearest bus stop is? No, our smart app will work out the closest pick-up and drop-off location points and the app/phone operator will tell you where these are.


Are wheelchair accessible vehicles available? Yes! You can let us know you need a wheelchair accessible vehicle in the app. Simply tap the menu in the upper left of the screen, then tap your name to access Account details. Next, tap Special settings and turn on Wheelchair accessibility. You can also give us a call.

Fares: £2 for adults; £1 for children; Concessionary and Older Person's Bus Passes accepted.

Service hours: Monday-Saturday 7am-7pm.

We are in the South Zone and the bus will take you to Midsomer Norton, Radstock and Odd Down Park & Ride.

Booking a ride is quick and easy with the *WEST* link app.





1. Create an account

Download the *WEST*link app from the App Store or Google Play Store and follow the simple sign-up steps. You can also call us at 0117 457 8561.

2. Book a ride

Enter your pick-up and drop-off addresses, choose the ride that works best for you, and tap **Book ride**.

3. Meet your WESTlink ride

Check the app to find exactly where to meet the vehicle. It may be a short walk from where you are, but your designated pick-up point helps to cut down on detours and make your journey faster!
