"The wilderness of despair" by Matthew Street, The Vicar, based on Luke 7:19, 21-23

Calling two of his disciples, John sent them to the Lord to ask, 'Are you the one we've been anticipating or should we await someone else?' Now Jesus had just healed many of diseases, afflictions and evil spirits, and given sight to many who were blind. He replied, 'Go and report to John the things you have seen and heard: how the blind see again, the lame walk, lepers become whole, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor hear good news. Blessed is everyone who has no problem understanding this.'. (Luke 7:19, 21-23)

There are days when life seems utterly bleak. We listen to the news and it is another catalogue of disaster, tragedy, hatred and violence. We look around us, and we see greed, division and selfishness. We look within, and where once there was faith now there is doubt. It felt like that for John the Baptist in the days following his arrest.

Having spent his ministry as a voice in the desert, he found himself in a different sort of wilderness: the wilderness of despair. Had all his efforts been for nothing? Had he been taken in, naively putting his faith in a sovereign purpose that simply didn't exist? Was Jesus an impostor, not the Messiah after all? No wonder John sent messengers to Jesus seeking reassurance, asking what exactly was going on. Only then the message came back: news of a different sort, good things happening, signs of hope, new beginnings, new life. What that news meant to John back in the darkness of his cell we are not told, but I imagine it was all he needed to hear, giving him strength to face his imminent death with a quiet and calm assurance, the knowledge that God's will would triumph. His story is a reminder to all who find themselves in the wilderness of despair: stop and look again, for there, in the apparent barrenness all around you, you will see the seeds of God's kingdom, the proof of his love, bursting into new and irrepressible life.
