"A new beginning" by Matthew Street, The Vicar, based on Luke 2:21-24, 39-40

When eight days had passed, the time came to circumcise the child; and they called him Jesus, the name the angel had given even before conception. When the time came for him to be purified according to the law of Moses, they brought him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord". They offered a sacrifice as prescribed in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle doves or two young pigeons'. When they had done everything the law of the Lord required, they returned to their hometown of Nazareth in Galilee. The child grew in strength and wisdom; and God's favour rested on him. (Luke 2:21-24, 39-40)

"And it's from the old I travel to the new" – so runs the popular hymn of Sydney Carter - and those words perfectly capture a truth at the heart of the gospel: that in Christ we see a new beginning. Yet, read the account of Jesus' presentation at the temple and you could be excused for thinking that nothing was going to change after all. Jesus was brought according to the law of Moses; presented at the temple as it is written in the law of the Lord, and a sacrifice offered as prescribed in the law of the Lord. It was only when they had done everything the law required that Mary and Joseph felt able to return home.

Do not be fooled, however, for once Jesus began his ministry it became clear that he brought a decisive break with the old. 'You have heard it said', he told the crowd, concerning various points of the law,'but I say to you', after which he set out a new and revolutionary interpretation of established wisdom. This was a break with the past, a parting of the ways between old and new, but it was not a complete parting, for he was also able to say, 'Do not think I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfil. From the old had come something new. Turn from the birth to the death of Jesus, for thirty-three years later he was presented to God in Jerusalem once again, only this time there were to be no sacrifices offered on his behalf - he was the sacrifice! Here, supremely, is the Christ who brings new life out of old, transforming what has been into what shall be. He continues to do the same in our lives today, taking what we are and reshaping our lives day by day into a new creation.

About YCDT

The Young Carers Development Trust (YCDT) is a charity set up in 2012 to empower young carers and raise their aspirations, to achieve their ambitions and to have the same opportunities in life as their non caring peers. We support young carers who are providing a significant level of care for a disabled or seriously ill family member, resulting in much poorer outcomes for their own health and future expectations.



What do we do?

Long Term Programme

Each young carer is matched to a volunteer Development Mentor who offers long-term support and advice throughout their time with YCDT. In addition to mentoring our support can include private tuition, equipment, travel costs to visit universities/colleges, support with apprenticeships and help finding work experience. The average mentor spends about 4 hours a month with their mentee. We have supported over 50 young carers through this programme.

Aspirations Conference

This annual conference for young carers age 14-18 offers a variety of workshops pertaining to higher education, going into employment and caring, delivered by various organisations, from universities to apprenticeship schemes. The next conference will be at Bath University in April 2025.

Group Mentoring Programme

This new programme, just completing its first year, supports young carers a year through a combination of group work and 1:1 mentoring support once a month. Groups will comprise of 4-8 young carers ages 14-18, meeting monthly for six months with individual support and signposting for several months before and after the group sessions.

Phoebe's Story

Phoebe has a complex caring role and provides support for her younger sister who has Autism, her father who has Epilepsy and Crohns Disease, which includes fits as a side effect, as well as her mother who has mobility issues. Phoebe has also faced her own challenges; she has Hypermobility Syndrome which can be very painful and her attendance at school has suffered due to this. Phoebe,18 years old, now attends University studying Psychology and Criminology and is getting on well. Phoebe is in her 4th and final year of YCDT support which in addition to a mentor, has included counselling for mental health issues, a bus pass to college, and a laptop light enough for her to carry.



"I didn't feel I could think about university, much less have the equipment and achieve the grades necessary to go. With the help of my Development Mentor Becky we found a laptop, a counsellor and a psychology tutor, funded by YCDT, who helped me over the course of my A Levels and I was able to get into university."

"Without the support of YCDT I strongly feel I would have not been able to achieve my goals."

Please Help Local Endangered Amphibians

Populations of common toads, frogs and newts are declining rapidly in the UK. Thousands are killed on roads each Spring as they migrate to the breeding ponds they have used for generations.

CAN YOU SPARE SOME TIME TO HELP OUR TOADS & FROGS CROSS A ROAD ?

- Our local rescue group saves approximately 2000 amphibians each year from being killed by vehicles on their migration route to and from their breeding grounds in Tucking Mill Lane.
- We greatly need more volunteers to patrol on mild wet evenings in February and March.
- You can take part as little or as often as you like. Although, if possible, a regular once a week commitment would be very helpful.
- Volunteers patrol in teams of 2 or more on a shift system for approximately 1.5 hours between dusk and 9:30pm in Tucking Mill.
- Short training, hi-vis and answers to your questions are provided.
- All volunteers must meet the insurance policy criteria. Apologies, but the insurance scheme restricts patrollers to adults only. Everyone is required to complete a Patrollers form.
- You will need warm clothes, a bucket, a good torch, and non latex gloves.
