The other day, I was flipping through an old holiday scrapbook that I had put together when I was about nine. It was from my very first proper holiday, and as I turned the pages, all sorts of memories came flooding back—things I hadn't thought about in years. It was both touching and fascinating to recall those long-ago moments, to remember how things felt back then.

There's something valuable about taking time to look back. Just as there's something important about looking ahead, both have their place. However, I think we need to be cautious with both, because each comes with its own kind of danger. It's so easy to get caught up in nostalgia or worry about what's to come, that we completely miss what's happening right now—today.

So often, especially in the early part of life, we rush from one thing to the next always striving, always planning for the next goal or milestone. Then, later on, we find ourselves looking back, remembering "the good old days," and wishing we'd savoured them more while we were living through them.

The truth is, there's something to be said for learning to live in the present moment, not carelessly or thoughtlessly, but in a way that's grateful, attentive, and open. There's so much we miss when we're distracted by what was or what might be.

By all means, let's give thanks for the past—it's shaped us and holds precious memories. And let's look to the future with hope and anticipation. But most of all, let's not forget the gift of the present. As the psalm says, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." Let's not let it pass us by unnoticed.
