"Not as bad as it seems" by Matthew Street, the Vicar, based on 1 Kings 19:1-5a, 9b-10. Ahab told Jezebel everything Elijah had done and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. So Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah to say, "May the gods deal with me, be it ever so severely, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like that of one of them." Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, while he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. "I have had enough, Lord," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors." Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep. And the word of the Lord came to him: "What are you doing here, Elijah?" He replied, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too. (1 Kings 19:1-5a, 9b-10)

There's an old Arabian proverb that states: "Things are not as bad as they seem." That is the truth learned by Elijah in the story above. He had just experienced one of the high spots in his ministry, when the prophets of Baal were humiliated on Mount Carmel, but, as is so often the case, a high quickly gave way to a low. Presumably, Elijah had imagined that, following his earlier triumph, his troubles were over; that Jezebel and her prophets would have to admit defeat. Instead, he discovered that she had renewed her campaign against him with an even greater ferocity. As far as Elijah was concerned, it was him and God against the world, and he was fed up with fighting a one-man battle. God, though, had a surprise up his sleeve, for Elijah was shortly to discover that he was anything but alone - that, in fact, there were seven thousand people in Israel who had not bowed the knee to Baal.

There is a continuing message in this for us today. In the Church, we can feel up against it, struggling to keep the doors of our buildings open, demoralised by lack of members, disheartened by the limited impact of our efforts. As individuals, we can feel we are ploughing a lonely furrow, or simply find that life is getting on top of us. Through the experience of Elijah, God is saying, 'Don't be dismayed; all things are less dreadful than they seem.' However isolated you may feel, he has not left you to carry the load alone. Seen or unseen, there are others playing their part and working for his kingdom. Seen or unseen, he is always there to strengthen, to support and to see us through.

Fare Car Scheme

Covering the Combe Hay, Shoscombe, South Stoke and Wellow area and run by V Cars for the West of England Combined Authority.

What is Fare Car? Fare Car is available to residents of the Combe Hay, Shoscombe, South Stoke and Wellow area. Fare Car is a safe and friendly shared taxi service at special rates. Fare Car is operated by V Cars (formerly Bath Taxis) with financial support from West of England Combined Authority.

Who can use Fare Car? Fare Car is available to everyone who lives in the designated Fare Car Zone (see map).

Where does Fare Car go? Passengers can travel from their home address to and from Bath City Centre. Fare Car will do its best to reach any address but some points may not be accessible by the vehicle.

When does Fare Car run? Fare Car is available on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays but not Public Holidays.

How many journeys are available? On Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and 2 journeys are available from the rural area into Bath, and 2 journeys are available back from Bath to the rural area. Please see the timetable for further details.

Fare Car Timetable: Operating Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday (not Public Holidays)

Arrives in Bath 10.30 a.m. or 11.30 a.m. Departs from Bath 1 p.m. or 12.30pm

Where are the pick up and drop off points in Bath? As shown on the map, the designated points are:

Drop off locations: Henry Street (by Marks & Spencers); Upper Borough Walls (RNHRD main entrance).

Pick up locations: Henry Street (by Marks & Spencers); Upper Borough Walls (RNHRD main entrance).

Is the service wheelchair accessible? Yes, Fare Car is wheelchair accessible. Please notify the operator when booking if you are a wheelchair user.

Do I have to book the return journey? Do I have to book the journey back from Bath at the same time as I book the journey to Bath? You can if you wish, but you do not have to. The journey back from Bath to the rural area can be booked up to 30 minutes in advance of the time of travel. There is a free phone to V Cars in the food hall of Marks & Spencers.

What is the cost? The fare is £1.50 per person per single trip. The service works on a flat fare basis so from any point between the rural area and Bath the fare is £1.50. This is a subsidised fare and there are no further reductions for Diamond Travelcard holders or children.


How do I use Fare Car? If you are a resident in the designated Fare Car Zone, firstly you need to be issued with your Fare Car membership number. Please call 0117 374 1265 to obtain your free Fare Car membership. Our travel advisors will complete the registration process by asking you for your name, address, and contact telephone number. You will then be issued with your Fare Car membership number.

How do I book a Fare Car journey? Bookings must be made in advance of the time of travel. To travel on the journey that arrives in Bath City Centre at 10.30am please book no later than 9am. For the journey that arrives in Bath City Centre at 11.30am please book no later than 10 am. To travel on the journey that departs Bath City Centre at 12.30pm please book no later than 12 noon. For the journey that departs Bath City Centre at 2pm please book no later than 1.30pm. Bookings may be made up to 1 week in advance. Follow the steps below to make your booking:

- 1. Select the journey, or journeys, you wish to travel on from the timetable.
- 2. Phone V Cars on 01225 447777 between 8am and 4pm Monday to Friday.
- 3. Quote the Fare Car membership number for each person wishing to travel (if you do not have a Fare Car membership number, obtain one by calling 0117 374 1265).
- 4. Tell the operator the day/date you wish to travel, journey time, pick up address, drop off location, and the details of the homeward journey if required. Please tell the operator if you are a wheelchair user.
- 5. You will then be given an approximate pick up time.
