Despite its message of joy and celebration, Christmas is a time of mixed emotions, meaning different things for different people. For some it will indeed be a time of celebration, bringing family get-togethers, parties, the giving and sharing of presents, the laughter of children, feasting and merriment. For others, by contrast, it will bring pain. It may be the memory of a loved one who has recently died that hurts, or of an earlier bereavement around Christmas. It may be the recollection of bygone years before children grew up and left home to start a family their own. It may be the burden of sickness, disability or terminal illness. Or it may be the continuing suffering of countless millions across the world facing the ever-present reality of poverty, homelessness, hunger and disease. Many will have little, if anything, to celebrate, in worldly terms. Christmas may be a time of joy, but not everyone will be rejoicing.

Yet it is precisely here that we glimpse the true wonder of the Christmas message, for at its heart is the proclamation that God became flesh, taking on our humanity. In other words, he understands what we are going through, whatever it might be. He doesn't just sympathise with our pain and sorrow; he empathises. He doesn't stand aloof from the daily round of life, for he has shared in it himself and is involved in our human situation. Christmas is a time of joy, but it is not just for the joyful; it is a time of celebration but it is not reserved for those who are celebrating. It is a time of good news for all, whether they laugh now or weep, rejoice or despair. God has entered our world so that, whatever we face now, we know that he is with us in it, and that his love will finally bring joy and blessing to all.

of Canteen Lane with the High Street, instead of the four locations as previously suggested. This will reduce the cost of a new survey. The Parish Council will enquiry if the Ward Councillor Empowerment Fund, which the Council has applied for previously, is still available with the revised suggestion. Wellow Traffic Working Group will obtain a new quotation for formal consideration at the next PC meeting in December.

Wellow Community Bus reported that several road issues on the bus route have been reported to BANES.

Assets of Community Value: this item was introduced to consider Fox and Badger Pub as an Asset of Community Value meaning that if the pub is put on the market for sale within 5 years, the resident would have 6 months to raise the finance to buy it. The Council agreed to support this proposal and will look into the process required.

Highways and Transport: The Council supported the idea of carrying out a speed survey at Canteen Lane and asked Wellow Traffic Working Group to submit a new traffic survey quote for consideration at the next meeting.

The preparations for the Community Speed Watch is nearly complete. It has 5 volunteers and 3 approved sites, including the east side. As soon as the Road Site Training is complete, the equipment will be sent out to begin the survey.

Play park: No update

Climate change: Wellow Climate Resilience Group is formed by residents and is led by the Cllr. Marchelle Farrell. At this stage the group already consists of 10 people. At this stage the necessary information is being gathered and the next steps are identified. As soon as the action plan is agreed, it will be presented to the Parish Council for their approval and support. Also, for those not able to attend, the unanimous decision was taken to approach Wellow Recreation to oversee making the flower show a whole village show involving different organisations rather than it just being run by Hort. Soc. This is necessary as the flower show committee wish to retire or substantially reduce their huge workload. As everyone in the parish is automatically a member of Wellow Rec., they are an obvious choice and they are also a registered charity. We wait to hear their response.

The West of England Combined Authority provides support to several bus services operating in the West of England, these are called supported bus services. As part of an ongoing review of these services, they are surveying their existing passengers and potential new passengers to help them understand how supported bus services can be improved. They want your thoughts on what would encourage you to use bus services more often and what they will look like in the future.

Surveys will be available on their supported bus routes over the next few days. Alternatively, an electronic survey can be completed here: https://consultation.west-of-england-ca.gov.uk/infrastructure/west-of-england-supported-bus-services-survey/

This process sits alongside their work with bus operators and the local councils to improve infrastructure and journeys through improved bus priority, bus lanes, bus stops, electronic real-time information and publicity.
