"The God who travels with us" by Matthew Street, The Vicar, based on Exodus 13:21-22

The Lord went ahead of them the whole time, a pillar of cloud to guide them by day and a pillar of fire to lighten their way by night so that they could travel by day or night. Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night moved from its place in front of the people. (Exodus 13:21-22)

Imagine what it must have been like to be one of the people of Israel during the forty years of wandering in the wilderness. Many, no doubt, must have thought their flight from Egypt would be short, leading swiftly on to an exciting if somewhat uncertain future. The reality, however, was that a lifetime's journey lay ahead, living as nomads in search of the Promised Land. Precisely where that was and when they'd get there seemed hidden even from Moses. Yet, though the final destination was unclear, the route they had to take was not a matter of guesswork, for God was there to guide them. Just as he led Abraham, so now, through a pillar of cloud and fire, he directed their footsteps. They did not travel alone; God was travelling with them.

Few are privileged to receive such a clear sign of God's presence with them, but the principle is one that applies to each of us. As we journey through life, God is always there to share our pilgrimage - leading, encouraging, equipping, providing. We have no more idea of where our path may take us than Abram or Moses had, but we have the assurance that wherever we are asked to travel, he will travel with us.

Wellow Parish Council

The Parish Council meeting took place on Monday 10th January in the village hall. The following has been discussed:

Public Participation: A resident reported trailers being parked for some time in the village car park. Residents thanked the Council for the Carol service at the batch. A question was asked about tree planting in the village as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebration. This will be raised at the next Climate Change group.

Concerns were raised about off-road vehicles driving the byway (a BOAT, which is byway open to all traffic) behind Ford Farm running to Twinhoe, resulting in vehicles sliding off the byway and rolling down the hill towards private property. A Resident requested that the Parish Council assist in requesting BANES to make this a restricted byway as it is not suitable for off-roading. The Chairman has already contacted BANES Public Rights of Way Department and the Ward Councillor. Currently waiting for a response.

A "No HGV' sign was requested for Stoney Littleton Lane. The Council will contact BANES regarding this.

Parking at the School bend was reported again, which causes difficulty to other road users such as horse riders, farming and emergency vehicles to get through the village. School will be contacted to ask to send a message to parents.

Poor parking at Canteen Lane is still a problem, causing obstruction as there are no current enforcements in place. It was suggested that a public consultation is run in order to find out which type of enforcements residents of Wellow would like to see.

Concerns were raised about Parcel 2200 Norton Lane planning application and its owner's intention to keep 150 goats, which will create a lot of disturbing noise for nearby residents. The Parish Council is being urged to support residents in preventing this development.

Parish Council Vacancies: David Phillips has successfully been accepted as a new Councillor. The Declaration of Acceptance of Office and Register of Interests was signed by David Phillips and he took his seat at the Council.

Resignation of Julia Handel was noted by the Council. Notice of vacancy has been advertised.

Planning Applications:

The following application considered:

21/05303/LBA. Glebe Cottage Bull's Hill Wellow – Supported 21/05695/TCA. Wellow House, High Street – Supported 21/05259/FUL. Barn And Yard, Wellow Farm, Norton Lane. An earlier application under class Q was supported by the parish council, but refused by BANES and on Appeal. This new application was effectively a new build in the Green Belt and without "exceptional circumstances" in support. This application could not be supported by the PC.

Highways and Transport: An updated quote from Entran totalling £1,250.00 + VAT for commissioning survey and producing a letter was approved by the Council.

No update was received from the Community Speed watch group as the necessary equipment has not been received

Next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 7th February 2022 in the village hall.

We extend our sincere thanks to those people who have stepped into the breach to make sure the Show goes ahead in all its glory again this year. You are stars and we hope this will demonstrate how a renewed Village Show could be run in the future.

Just to finish on a gardening note – we are looking forward to collaborating with the newly formed Gardening Club at St. Julian's School. Also, if you haven't already bought your seeds, now is the time to do so. Any spare plants you grow can be saved for the Plant Sale in May and you will be able to select your prize-winners for the Show in due course. Good luck with all the planting and growing.
