Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!" So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. (John 20:1-8)

What does April make you think of? I love the crisp whiff of spring which lifts my spirits, seeing all the spring flowers and signs of new life, and even the refreshing April showers. Everything in nature seems full of new possibilities and hope and I find a new spring in my step. And as the seasons of the year turn, so Easter comes round for another time. And here is the opportunity for new life, new possibilities and new hope.

We've heard the story so many times: Jesus whose life was characterised by love, who captivated crowds with his words and who deeply touched the lives of individuals, was unjustly sentenced to death by the establishment and against all expectations returned to life three days later, defeating death. But it's easy to be like the disciple who stood outside the tomb, seeing the empty shroud, but unsure about going in. This new life that Jesus offers can only be experienced by entering into his welcome and invitation. We can anticipate the wonderful chocolatey taste of a packaged Easter egg, but it isn't until we take off the foil and actually eat it, that we can fully enjoy and experience it.

This Easter offers another opportunity to journey through this whole story – to bring to Jesus the pain that we feel about so many things going on in our world and our own lives, knowing that he, too, has known betrayal, rejection, unjustified allegations, physical pain and suffering. Regular congregation numbers continue at 15 to 20 people each Sunday, so plenty of room for more.

On Good Friday we have Meditation on the Cross at 3 p.m. and on Easter Sunday, Holy Communion at 10 a.m.

Wellow Parish Council

The Parish Council meeting took place on Monday 7th March in the village hall. The following discussions took place.

Public participation: The Parish Sweeper reported that the bin near the entrance to the church has been emptied regularly by a resident

It was also reported that debris stuck in the channels under the ford cause water levels to rise in the Wellow brook. Suggestion was made to organise a community event to clear it up.

A resident expressed a concern that Sulis Down development will affect future traffic in Wellow. Ways to discourage future traffic was discussed. WPC will contact Combe Hay and Dunkerton parish councils to discuss.

Planning Applications:

The following applications were considered:

22/00323/FUL: Willow Barn High Street -Supported

21/05700/FUL: Bubblers Dytch, High Street – Correspondence was sent to B&NES regarding previous enforcement action

The following planning decisions by B&NES Council was noted: 21/03507/FUL: Parcel 2200 Norton Lane – Permitted. Further correspondence with B&NES to be discussed.

Assets of Community Value: The response to the survey about inclusion of the Fox and Badger pub as an Asset of Community Value has been very positive with majority of respondents supporting the application.

Highways & Transport: The traffic survey is to commence shortly.

Community Speed Survey could not be started as the necessary equipment has not been sent.

The litter picking event has been delayed due to equipment not being available from B&NES. It was mentioned that Hinton Hill, which belongs to Hinton Charterhouse parish council has become unsightly due to litter, especially in a layby. Clerk will contact Hinton Charterhouse parish council to enquire whether they are planning to organise a litter pick and also B&NES to ask to provide a litter bin on the layby.

Public Rights of Way: Canteen Lane – update is to be received at the next meeting.

Climate Change: A village meeting about sharing information on alternative heating systems is organised on 21 March in the village hall. Climate Change Councillor was not present at this meeting, further updates is to be provided at next meeting.

Platinum Jubilee 2022: A plan of celebrations were outlined and agreed by the council. Clerk is to apply for the road closure. Concerns were raised about possible difficulties for farmers if the road is closed. Councillors agreed to contact local farmers. The organisers will summarise the funds required and apply at the next meeting.

The parish council agreed to appoint ALCA scheme for auditing the financial accounts 2021-22

Members noted that there was a slight increase in the Greensward ground maintenance contract for 2022-23 due to inflation.

Discussions took place about maintenance requirements to goal mouths and the football pitch. The District Councillor recommended we explore alternative solutions to verti-draining and top dressing used by Bath University. Further information will be investigated and discussed at the next meeting.

In praise of Dandelions.


