"Against the grain" by Matthew Street, The Vicar, based on Matthew 7:13 14.

Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad the way leading to destruction, and many are those who take that route, but the path leading to the gate of life is straight and narrow, and only a few find it. (Matthew 7:13-14)

Are you a DIY expert? I wish I was but, sadly, such skills have always eluded me. Take the time at school many years ago, when I was furiously planing a piece of wood that stubbornly insisted on splintering and snagging at every thrust of the blade. One look from my wood-work teacher told me I had gaffed again. "Plane with the grain," he told me, with a weary groan of despair, "not against it!" There was a simple lesson in that, not just for woodwork but also for life. Attempt to go against the grain and you will have problems – guaranteed.

Yet, as the words of Jesus make clear, on occasions we must be willing to do just that; to go against the grain of self-interest and received wisdom, of force of habit and expected behaviour, of family loyalties and personal inclination. It is not that we rebel for the sake of it, but there will be times when faith brings us into conflict with accepted norms and when the call of Christ means renouncing the way of the world. Such a path is never easy and we will always face the temptation to take a less-demanding option, a course of less resistance, but though that way may seem attractive, its lure is ultimately deceptive, for in running from the challenge we run from life itself; the life God wants us to know in all its fullness.

Wellow Parish Council

The Parish Council met on Monday 5th September in the Village Hall. Councillors present: Pat Caudle, David Phillips, Sue Chivers, Nick Chapman, Debbie Clarkson, David Phillips Apologies received from Nigel Thomas. No Interests were declared. The Clerk and 2 residents attended.

Public Participation: A resident enquired what can be done if an overhanging neighbouring tree with ash dieback needs to be cut back. It was suggested B&NES were asked for advice.

The Chairman congratulated the organisers of Wellow Flower show on another successful event!

Planning: The following planning applications were considered. Draft Comments to B&NES discussed:

22/02736/LBA: Moss Cottage, Railway Lane. The Council leave decision to B&NES officer

22/03263/FUL: The Old Orchard, High Street. Support

22/03288/FUL: St Julian's Church, High Street. Support

22/03169/FUL: West End House. The Council leave the decision to B&NES officer

22/03071/FUL: Glebe Cottage, Bull's Hill. Support

22/03083/LBA. 3 The Square. No comments from the PC

22/03392/TCA: Manor Lodge, Farm Lane. Support

The following planning decisions by B&NES Council noted:

22/02274/ADCOU: Barn at Upper Hayes, Bath Hill. Approved 22/22440/FUL: Dawn Rise, High Street. Permitted

The Parish Council has expressed a concern about B&NES enforcement cases being delayed and not actioned.

The Council noted a completion of inclusion of Fox and Badger pub.

Highways and Transport : The Council received an update from the Community Speed Watch stating that it's going very well. There are 6 volunteers involved, 158 warning letters have been sent out. The Speed Watch team is working on 4 different sites at different times. The Council will liaise with B&NES about devices to be used to make people aware of speeding.

A consultation note will be posted in the Parish Post about the advisory white lines to be applied at Canteen Lane and High Street junction to prevent inconsiderate parking. The Council will inform B&NES of the exact site.

It was noted that a 30mph zone has been extended past the Livery Centre.

A request for replacement of a stile at the Bath Hill junction with the footpath from Farm Lane was noted.

Wellow Recreation: The Annual Playground safety report has been reviewed by the Council and some recommended minor remedial works are to be carried out.

Discussion took place about installation of a defibrillator on the Village Hall wall for the users of the playing fields, tennis courts and the play park. It was suggested that the cost is to be shared between Magic Box, Wellow Valley Tennis and Wellow Parish Council (the Village Hal could also be asked again for a donation). The Council thought it is best if the Village Hall or Wellow Recreation is responsible for the ongoing maintenance of this additional village defibrillator.

It was suggested that the Council make a final decision at the next meeting when the roles and responsibilities have been discussed by the Village Hall and Wellow Recreation Committees.

Climate Change: 240 hedge weeps are to be delivered shortly, which will be planted at the top of the playing fields. A note in the Parish Post will be posted to ask volunteers to help with planting and digging holes.

The Council noted that Wellow has been identified as a site for investment in renewable energy options by B&NES. They are beginning the community consultation process, and will be holding a workshop in Beacon Hall, Peasedown St John.

Community Infrastructure Levy: The current shortlist of ideas:

1. Create a proper gravel path from Henley View to the car park.

Wellow has been awarded a Large Wild Harvest Community Tree Pack from the Woodland Trust. It will be planted along the north side of Wellow Recreation Ground, and will provide vital food and habitat for wildlife, and also increase Wellow's tree canopy.

This planting was the inspiration of the late Queen as part of the Platinum Jubilee Year celebrations. It will now form an even more poignant commemoration of her legacy. 2. To install a bench at the Ford.

3. To contribute towards the cost of improvements to the drainage and surface of the Village Hall carpark.

A survey will be published to ask residents for their preference and maybe new ideas before a final decision is made.

Finance and Administration: The new mailing system has been reviewed and confirmed that it works well.

External Auditor Report for the accounts 2021-22 has been noted. The Council noted that there were no requests received to exercise the Public Rights for the accounts for 2021-22. The Village Hall Drive repair schedule has been discussed.

Items to raise for consideration at the next meeting: Purchase of defibrillator for installation on the Village Hall wall.

Ideas for spending Community Infrastructure Levy money.

What is the workshop?

This interactive workshop will explore how this can be done in the Peasedown and Wellow area. We're seeking the views and input of as many local people as possible. The workshop is not in connection with a particular planning proposal or the council's planning policies. It is a hypothetical and exploratory session.

The workshop will be hosted by the Centre for Sustainable Energy (CSE), a charity supporting people and organisations across the UK to tackle the climate emergency and end the suffering caused by cold homes.

What will happen in the workshop? It will explore:

- What types of renewable energy could be acceptable and suitable in your area.
- Where renewable energy generation could be located.
- How your community could shape energy development.
- What you can do to save money on your fuel bills.

The workshop is aimed at anyone who lives or works in the area. All are welcome. You don't need to know anything about renewable energy as there will be information provided during the workshop. There's a useful guide to the main types of renewable energy generation on this page of the project website.

What happens after the workshop? After the workshop, a detailed summary of what was discussed will be posted on the project website here. People will have the chance to comment and share their opinions on this through a survey. The findings of the workshop and the views expressed in the survey will be included a report for local people and Bath and North East Somerset Council.

Can I claim expenses? To allow as many people as possible to attend, we will contribute to people's costs, if they need it, for travel or childcare up to a maximum of \pounds 40.
